MAGDOLNA JÁKFALVI

Magdolna Jákfalvi is a professor of theatre history at the University of Theatre and Film Arts, Budapest. She has published several books and articles on the topics of contemporary drama theory, both the Hungarian and the European Avant-garde, and the ways in which politics of memory interact with theatre. Among others, she wrote Alak, figura, perszonázs. Színházolvasás I ("Form, Figure, Personage." Comprehending Theatre I, 2001) and Avantgárd—színház—politika ("Avant-Garde—Theatre—Politics," 2006). In 2011 she published a monograph on the works of Racine, entitled A félrenézés esetei: Jean Racine drámái ("Wrong Viewings and Ignored Interpretations: The Dramatic Works of Jean Racine") in which she examines how the reception history of his plays influenced subsequent approach to them.

She is the co-founder of the *Theatron* (Journal of Theatre studies), the *Philther*-hub (www.philther.hu) and in 2018, the Kálmán-project. In the last decade, her research is focused on the State Socialist practice of Hungarian Theatre after WW2, on the sovietised reception history of the performances, on the transformation of the Viennese operetta into nationalised one.
